## Keynote Speaker: Stanford Psychology Professor Carol Dweck

Professor Dweck joined the Stanford faculty in 2004, after having taught at the University of Illinois, Harvard University, and Columbia University. Her current research work integrates the study of social, developmental, and personality psychology. Since the 1970s, she has published numerous articles on the origins of implicit self-beliefs and how these self-conceptions guide behavior and influence motivation and achievement. Recently, some of her work has looked to school-aged children to examine how praise for children's performance can shape their beliefs about their intelligence, influence their self-esteem, and affect academic motivation.
